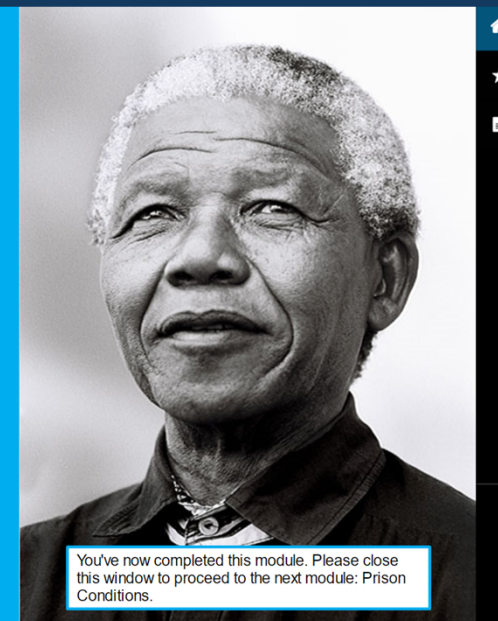
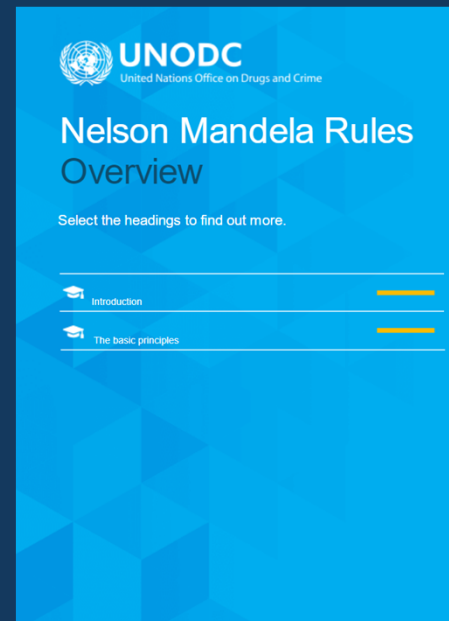
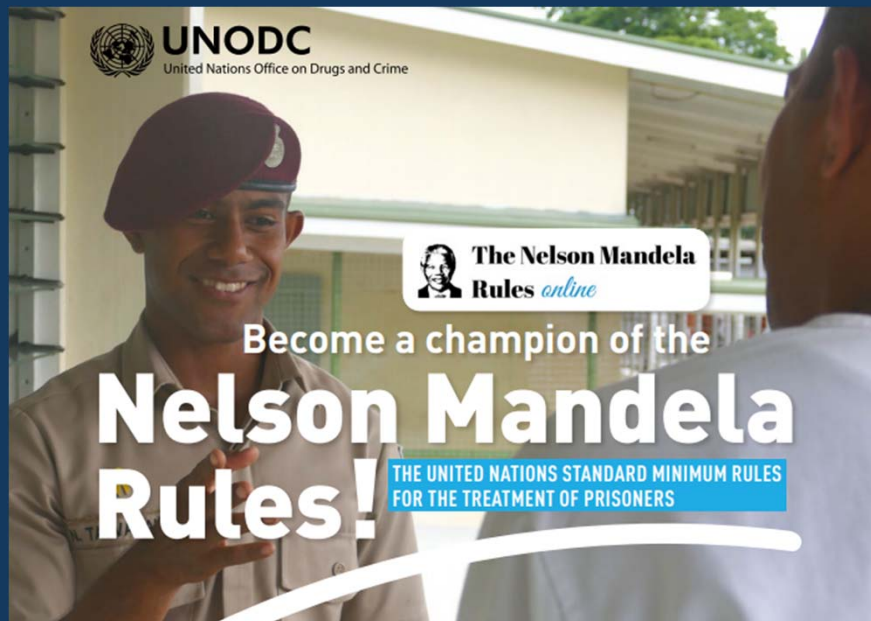


Outcomes Sought

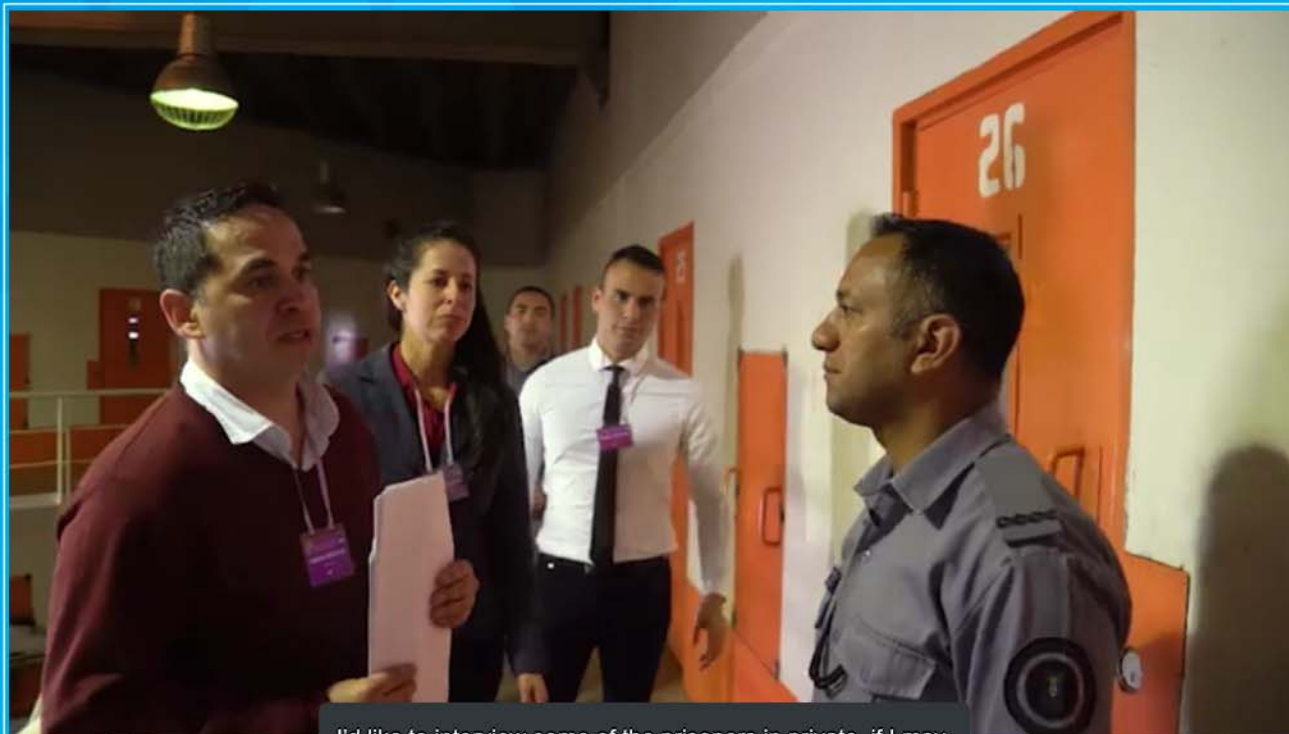


UNODC Nelson Mandela Rules - External inspections
