## GENDER-RESPONSIVE CRIMINAL JUSTICE AND PRISON REFORM

20<sup>th</sup> May – 24<sup>th</sup> June 2020



Criminal justice and prison systems face unprecedented challenges that are amplified by the COVID-19 global pandemic. In systems dealing primarily with male offenders and prisoners, gender-responsive approaches to criminal justice are crucial to ensure the health, safety and rehabilitation of women in conflict with the law. Ten years after the adoption of the United Nations Rules for the Treatment of Women Prisoners and Non-custodial Measures for Women Offenders (the Bangkok Rules), a global dialogue is needed to promote their full implementation.

Organized by Thailand Institute of Justice (TIJ) and the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC), this webinar series will provide a platform for experts to discuss challenges faced by women in conflict with the law and share tools, experiences, lessons learned and good practices, both in reducing the spread of COVID-19 in prisons and in relation to longer-term criminal justice and prison reform, in line with the Bangkok Rules.
